CRC and CRC Project streams

CRCs

- Medium/long term – up to ten years
- Large collaborations (average 30-40 partners)
- No specified limit to funding
- One two-stage round per year

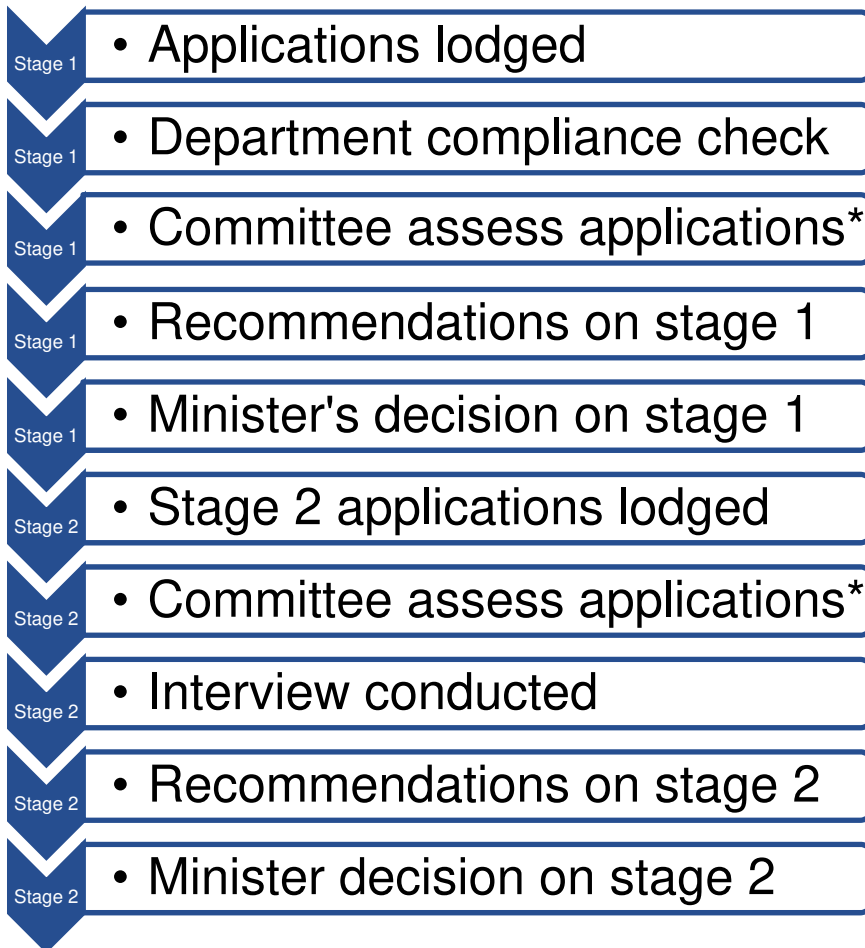
CRC Projects

- Short term – up to three years
- Small collaborations (average 5 partners)
- Maximum \$3 million per project
- Two single-stage rounds per year

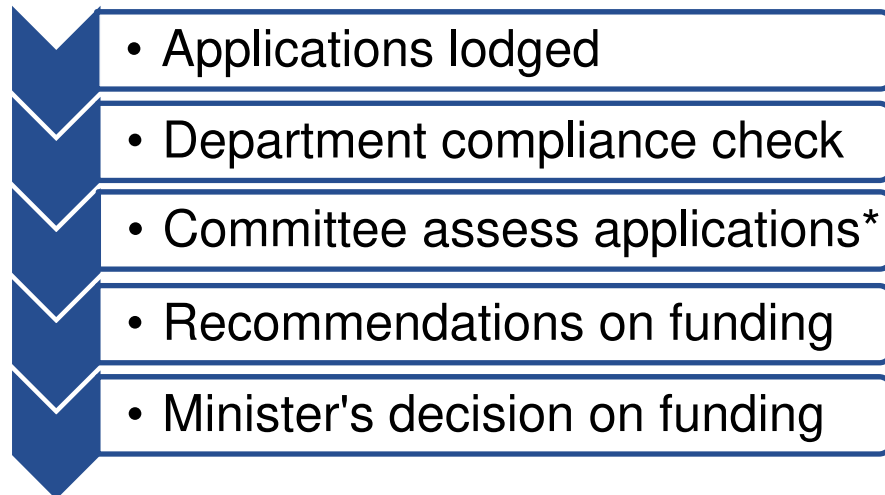
- Funded for a single, specified term
- Matching contributions required (can be in cash and in-kind)

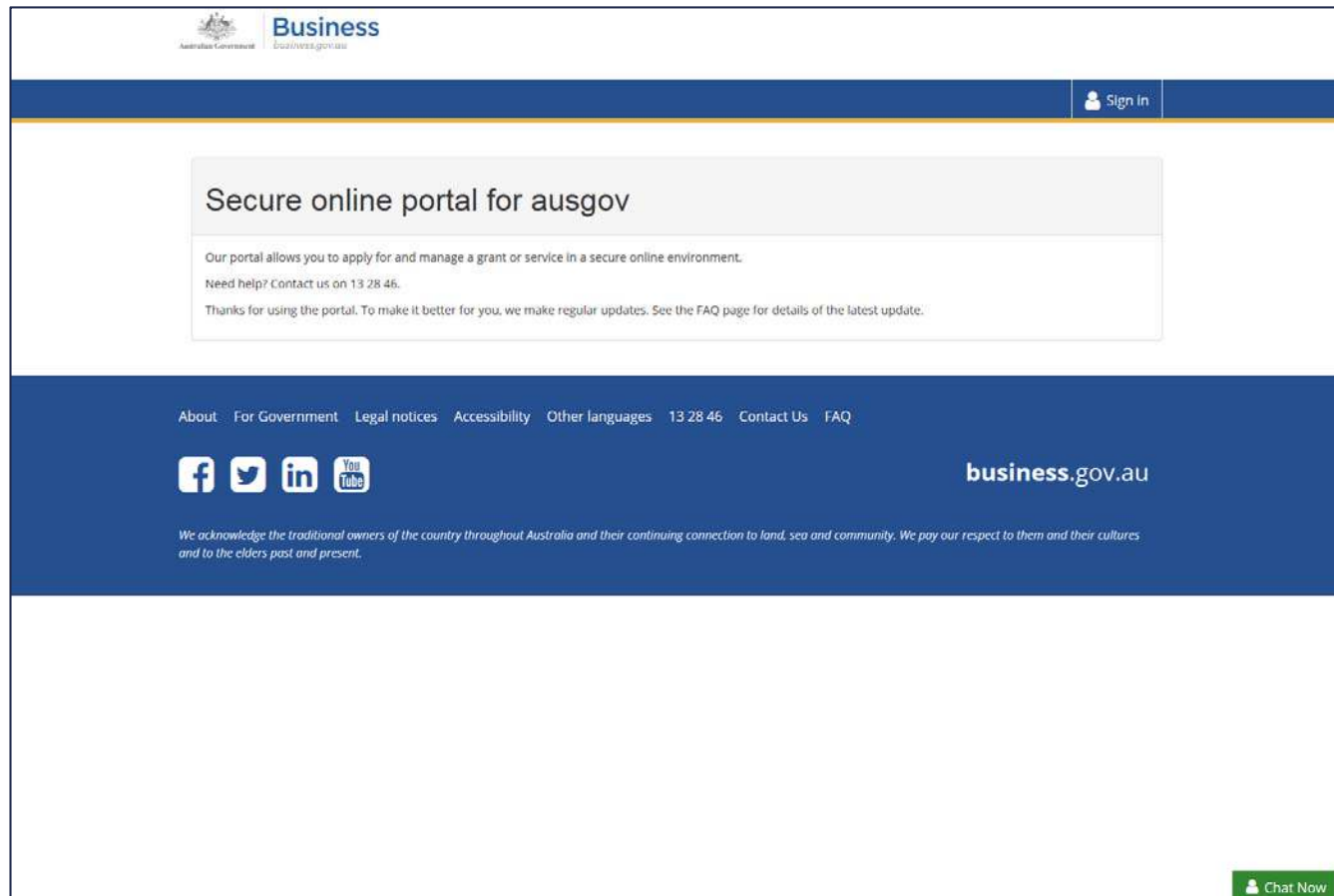

About the Cooperative Research Centres Program

The Cooperative Research Centres (CRC) Program aims to improve the competitiveness, productivity and sustainability of Australian industries, especially where Australia has a competitive strength, and in line with government priorities. The Program will foster high quality research to solve industry-identified problems through industry-led and outcome-focused collaborative research partnerships between industry entities and research organisations. The Program aims to encourage and facilitate small and medium enterprise (SME) participation in collaborative research.

Compliant CRC applications are considered in two stages on merit and against all other CRC applications at each stage. At Stage 1 the applicant provides a statement of claims against the selection criteria and a description of the proposed research programs. Successful Stage 1 applicants will be invited to submit a Stage 2 application. The Stage 2 process requires the applicant to provide a full written business case and to present that business case in an interview.

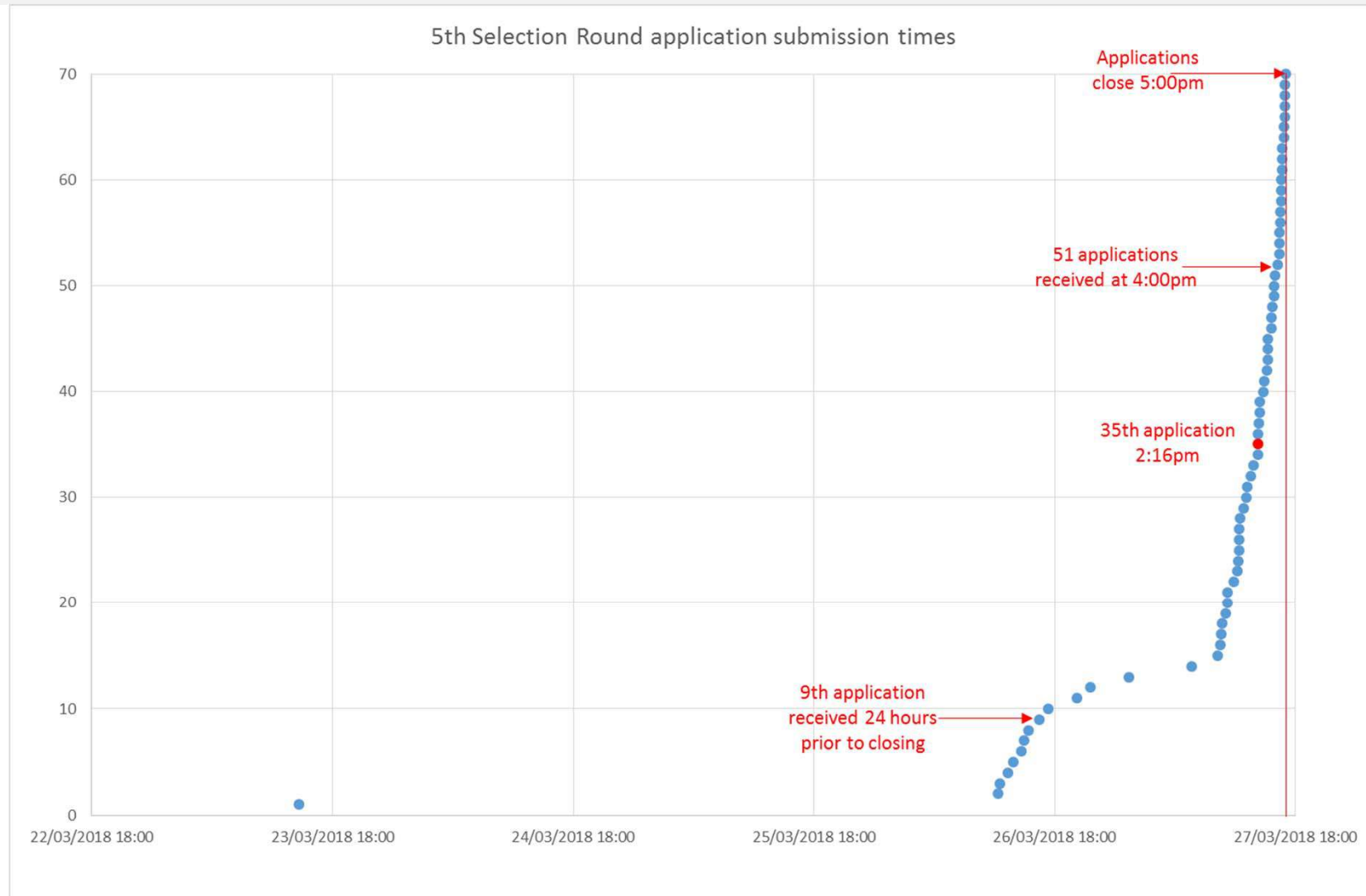
In summary

Make sure you meet eligibility and compliance requirements!

- Include sufficient and correct participants
- All participants must provide contributions (cash and/or in-kind)
- Complete, signed and unamended Participant Declarations must be provided for all participants
 - Consistent with the application (project and participant names and ABNs)
- Ensure consistency between income and expenditure and activity and delivery dates
- Do not include additional material
- Check your application before submission allowing enough time to correct any errors
- Applications must be submitted on time!

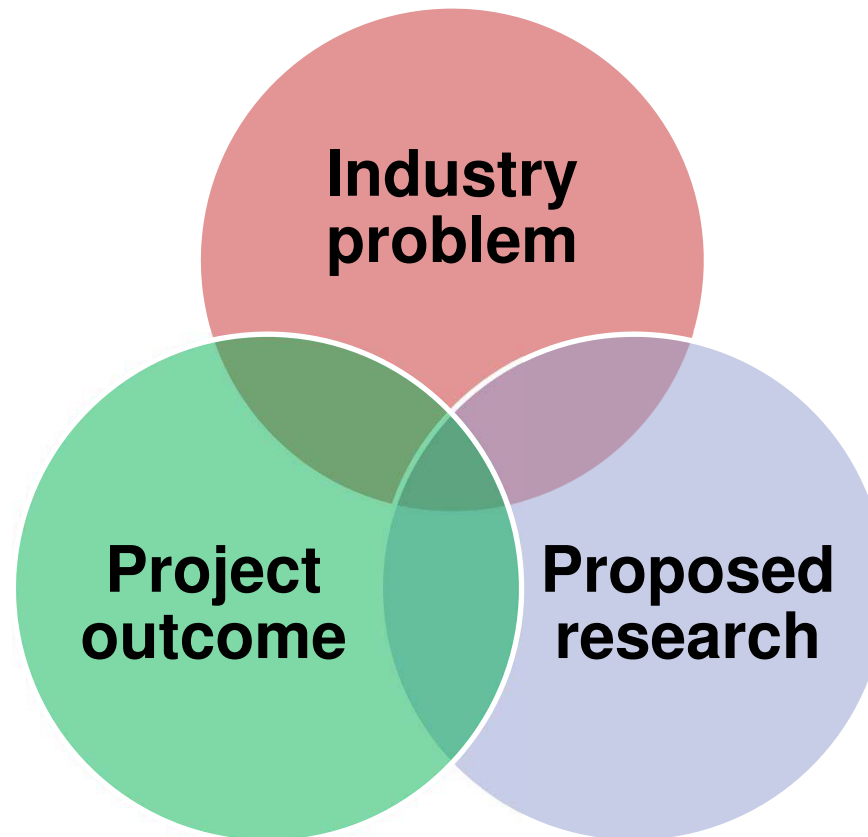


Timing of CRC projects received in 5th round



Make your application GREAT

*The Cooperative Research Centres (CRC) Program supports **industry-led** collaborations between industry, researchers and the community.*



Selection criteria in detail

- a) Expected industry outcomes (30%)
- b) Proposed research project (30%)
- c) Demonstrated governance and management capability (10%)
- d) Proposed education and training program (10%)
- e) Value for money (10%)
- f) Expected national benefits (10%)



» Criteria are not equally weighted!

Make your application GREAT

Overarching presentation of your application

- Plain English – is your application concise, have you avoided unnecessary jargon?
- Avoid repetition – read the factsheets and answer the question asked
- Sufficient detail and clarity against all criteria
- Succinct and well articulated industry challenge
- The application clearly outlines the essential activities to be undertaken

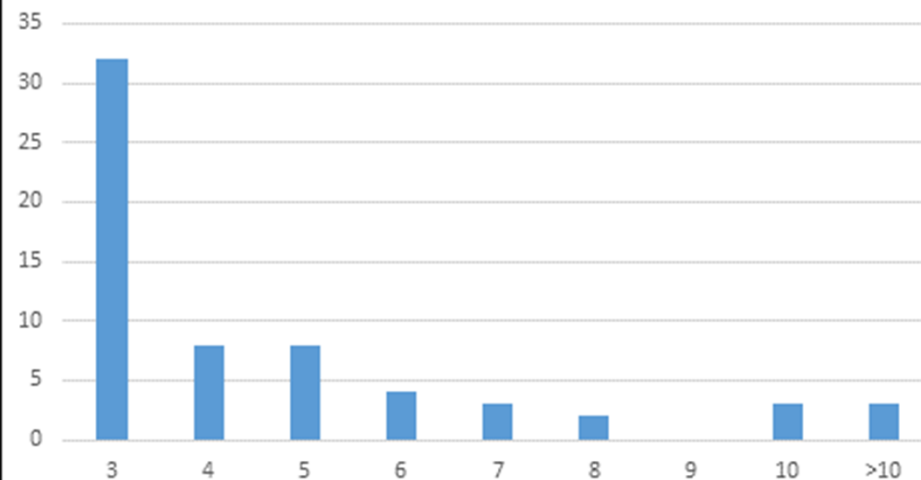

Participants

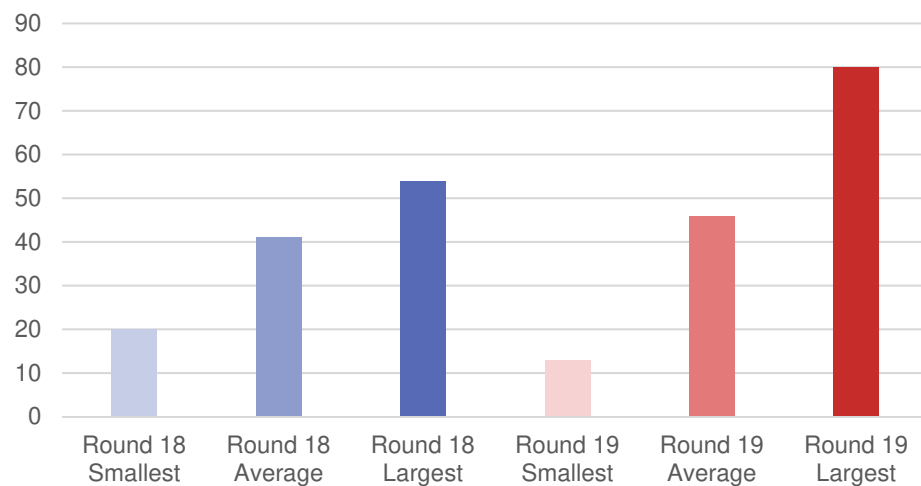
- Open to all industry sectors and research disciplines
- Broad collaboration is encouraged including Australian and international organisations, large and small companies, Commonwealth, state or territory or local government departments or agencies and publicly funded research organisations, such as the CSIRO
 - Have discussions early and be aware that some participants may only commit for 2-3 years
- All participants must contribute cash and/or in-kind resources.

Matched funding

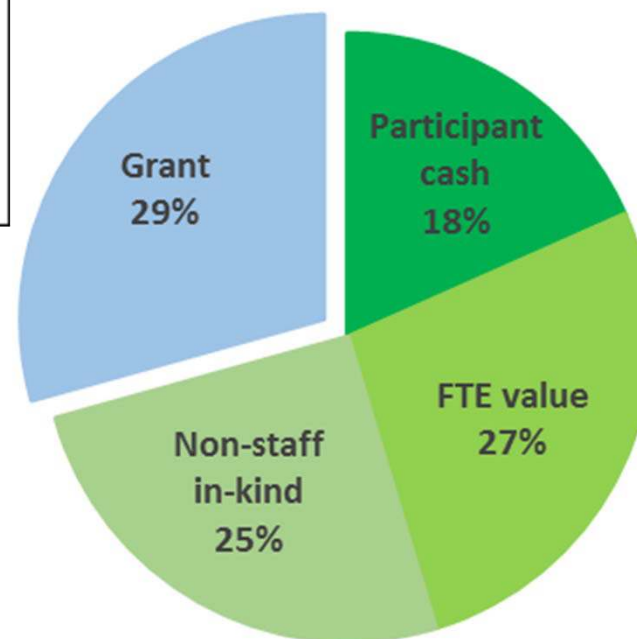
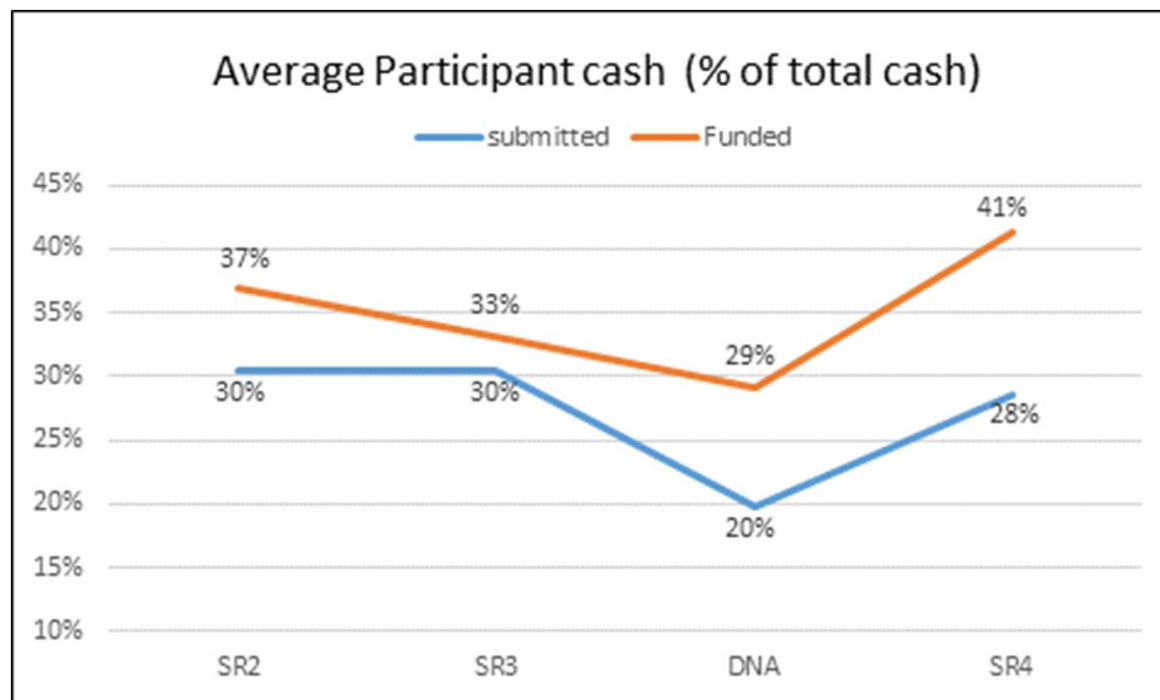
- Contributions from participants must be equal to or greater than the funding amount requested
- Cash and in-kind contributions are treated equally for compliance with matching requirements
- Contributions demonstrate that your participants support the proposed CRC and demonstrate their commitment to achieving the outcomes
- Make sure that the Government is only paying for something once

Use of Commonwealth Funds

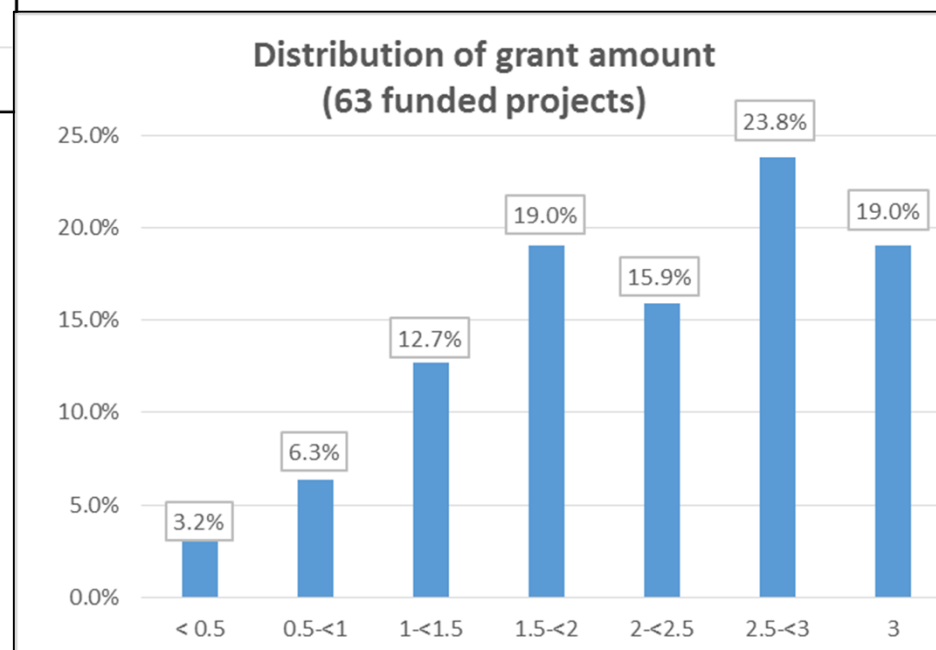
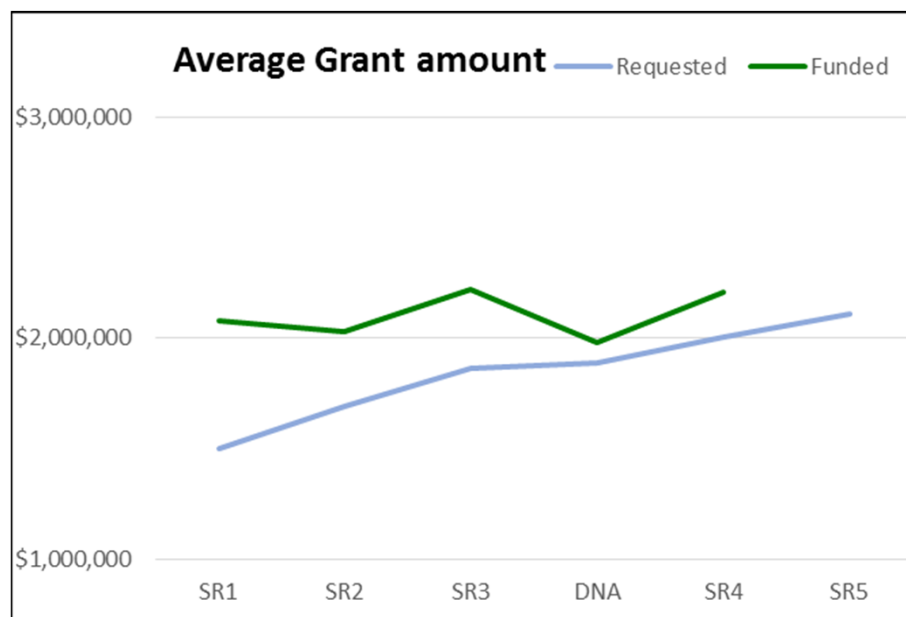
- Commonwealth Funded Activities means:

 - Capacity building



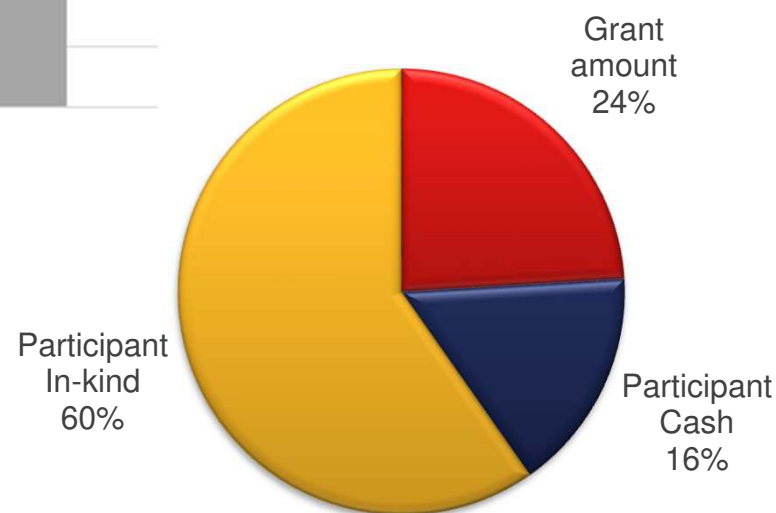
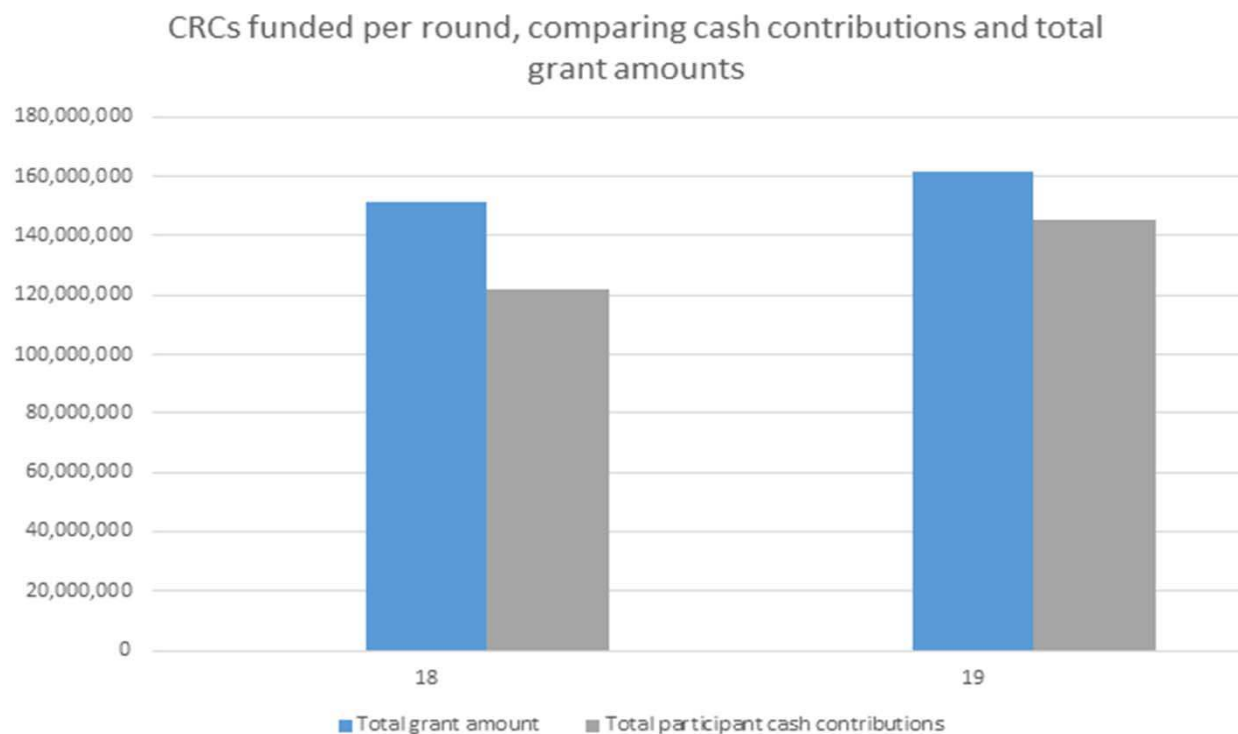
Cash contributions – CRC-Ps

- Ensure you have links with and have held discussions with the Industry Growth Centres
 - Alignment with Growth Centre priorities
 - Growth Centres can be a participant in a CRC or CRC-P

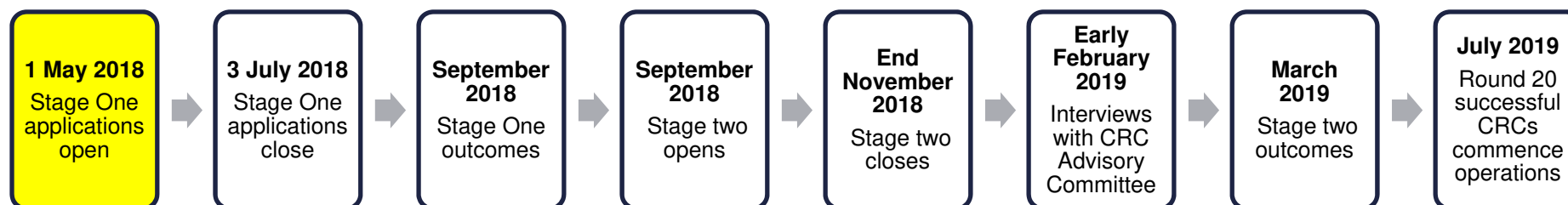
